BY-LAW 2025-001 REGARDING THE GENERAL PROPERTY TAX RATE, SERVICE RATES AND THE ANNUAL INTEREST RATE

ARTICLE 1

For the implementation of this budget, the general land tax and taxes for services will be levied according to the following chart:

Method of Payment

- Article 2 Method of payment of taxes in the present by-law are as follows:
 - All tax invoices to which the total does not exceed \$300.00 the invoice must be paid in one instalment on April 1st 2025.
 - 2) All tax invoices to which the total is or exceeds \$300.00, the debtor has the right to pay the invoice in one or two payments as follows:

Two equal instalments: -The first instalments must be paid by April 1st 2025 - The second instalment must be paid by July 1st 2025

Article 3 Taxes are payable at the Municipality office at 427 Route 148 Clarendon by cash or by cheque, payment to the order of The Municipality of Clarendon. Taxes may also be paid by electronic payment at identified financial institutions.

Interest Rates

Article 4 All accounts owing to the municipality bear interest at the rate of EIGHTEEN
PERCENT (18%) per annum from the deadline at which they must be paid.
However, only outstanding amounts on each instalment required bear interest.

Cming into Force

Article 5 The present by-law will come into force on the day of its publication, in accordance with the law.

9. ROAD GRANT RESOLUTION

WHEREAS the Department of Transportation has provided compensation in the amount of \$ 1 137 614 for the maintenance of the local road network for the calendar year 2024 under File # PLX72422 Local Road Maintenance Component (PAVL)

WHEREAS the compensation distributed to the Municipality is for the routine and preventive maintenance of local roads 1 and 2 as well as the bridge components, located on these roads, for which the Municipality is responsible

WHEREAS the compensation in full has been used for the routine and preventative maintenance of local roads 1 and 2 as well as bridge components for which the Municipality is responsible.

WHEREAS, an external auditor will submit a completed Schedule B or Special External Audit Report within the time frame specified for filing the Accountability Report.

169-11-2024 THEREFORE, on a motion by Cr. Elliott and Cr. Holmes, it was unanimously resolved and carried that the Municipality of Clarendon informs the Ministry of Transportation of the use of the compensation for the routine and preventive maintenance of local roads 1 and 2 as well as the bridge components, located on these roads, for which the Municipality is responsible, in accordance with the objectives of the Local Road Maintenance Assistance Program.
